"Indonesia in the year 2000 Plus: A Variety of Art Exhibitions"

After watching the recent exhibition organized by the New Fine Arts Group (*Kelompok Seni Rupa Baru*) at TIM entitled, "Fantasy World Department Store," (*"Pasaraya Dunia Fantasi"*), I sat on a park bench a bit away from the exhibition grounds outside so as not to be considered part of the exhibit. Suddenly a man appeared next to me. He was a foreigner who had traveled by time machine from the year 2000 Plus. I thought he must be a fictional character.

*transcendental.*⁹ So if we are dirty and rotten, it is ok, display works that are dirty and rotten. This is not just about art, but *total*¹⁰ art—it should be appreciated with all the senses. Since a work of art is contextual and total, you are not just limited to look at the art, but also to feel and to taste it." To strengthen this explanation he invited us to a place with piece entitled "Herbal Medicine Seller" (*Jamu Gendong*). We were invited to hold bottles of traditional herbs, even to taste them. But there was one jerk among us who pretending to misunderstand and grabbed at the woman seller.
