



### Introduction From The Gallery

Biasa Art Space presents 14 young Indonesian artists, coming from two distinct groups that live and work in Bali and in Bandung.

Even though the Bali group is composed by more experienced artists, nevertheless we show next to them the work of some younger and less experienced artists who refer themselves to the Abstrax group in Bandung,

In this context the meaning of transit points to forms and contents which are not fixed, not arrived at destination, playfully it reminds us of other trans-words: ..Trans-cultural, trans-fusion, trans-form...

The intent of this exhibition is to stimulate in the viewer an interest to witness and understand the passages of growth of young artists coming from different Indonesian realities, influenced by the socio political changes of their country and by global visual culture, showing a potential to choose an inner-directed approach to their art.

May this intent progress into offering the audience some unusual material that might inspire the patience to deal with art through intelligence and feeling.

I particularly like to see Indonesian work showing in this space. It is a way for me to offer a subtle and yet powerful feeling conducive to communicate between diversities. Further more I see the possibility for Biasa to become a support and an inspiration for artists with ability to produce significant work, whose desire to seriously come to terms with their art is stronger than the seduction of fame and career: I thank very much those who are presenting their work here, trusting this intention.

It is my hope that Biasa art space will grow to become a reference point where artists and audience can experience an intimacy in the sharing of human \_expression.

# TRANS-IT: A sense of two Cities

## Pengantar Kuratorial

Ketika representasi kembali menjadi perhatian penting dalam seni rupa kontemporer, rupa realistik merupakan bahasa yang signifikan untuk menjadi rujukan penciptaan dalam seni lukis. Pergerakan ini pula yang dapat disimak dalam pemeran keroyokan oleh empat belas seniman muda. Delapan seniman dari Klinik Seni Taxu Bali<sup>1</sup>:

Wayan Suja, Gede Puja, Gede Mahendra Yasa, Made Muliana, Agus Sumiantara, Ketut Moniarta, Dewa Ardana dan Dodit Artawan.

Enam seniman dari Kelompok Abstrax Bandung<sup>2</sup>:

Guntur Timur, C Gunawan Suryasaputra, Imam Setiawan, Wily Himawan, Dadan Setiawan dan Z. Ramli.

Mereka sama-sama beranjak dari kesadaran berkelompok, dan lebih spesifik lagi sama-sama konsen mengembangkan seni lukis (painting) dalam frame rupa realistik pada pencarian artistik karya-karya mereka. Sebelum kita menyentuh lebih lanjut pada persoalan yang mereka ungkapkan dalam karya, ada baiknya kita menyimak perihal kemunculan dua kelompok ini.

Klinik Seni Taxu lahir atas kegerahan sekumpulan mahasiswa terhadap situasi art world Bali khususnya, yang mereka rasakan berada dalam kondisi "undinamic", lewat sense yang serba "tunggal" dalam dominasi kecenderungan yang kerap disebut sebagai "abstrak ekspresionis Bali". Dalam pencarian artistik seniman Bali, yang umumnya berlandaskan pada penggalian muatan lokal (baca: tradisi, relegiusitas, dan budaya Bali) sepertinya menjadi bentuk pencarian "tunggal" dalam seni rupa Bali. Ditambah lagi bekerjanya infrastruktur seni rupa Bali dalam mendukung pencarian yang "tunggal" tersebut sepertinya "tidak memberikan peluang" hadirnya bentuk pencarian yang keluar dari sense tersebut. Spirit inilah yang mendasari pergerakan mereka selama empat tahun ini sehingga memunculkan sebentuk pencarian artistik yang mencoba keluar dari pencarian seni rupa Bali selama ini.

Mereka mulai keluar dari persoalan esoterik dan bahkan menjadi eksotis tersebut, dengan mengangkat persoalan terkini dalam medan sosial dan medan seni rupa Bali. Pilihan artistik mereka tertuju pada rupa realis yang secara kebetulan konek dengan kecenderungan seni lukis kontemporer yang berbasiskan pada persoalan representasi. Walaupun dalam prakteknya mereka tidak pernah mengungkung diri dalam ke-absolutan bahasa rupa realisme, bahasa representasi mereka luaskan tidak saja pada medium dua dimensi (lukisan) namun juga medium lain seperti; instalasi, video art dan lainnya. Taxu dalam hal ini diambil dari kata Taksu dari khasanah kesenian Bali. Taksu dalam khasanah kesenian di Bali, dipakai untuk menunjuk bentuk kesenian yang memiliki kekuatan magis sehingga bernilai sakral. Menurut mereka, taksu kemudian menjadi kelatahan dalam jualan kesenian pariwisata sehingga pelan-pelan kesakralan itu larut dalam entitas industri pariwisata, sehingga memunculkan sebentuk desakralisasi seni seiring stigma Bali sebagai wilayah eksotis. Pergeseran tersebut mereka sambut dengan menjadikan taksu sebagai taxu.

Bandung selama ini dikenal sebagai seni yang formalis, "laboratorium barat" demikian sebutan seni rupa Bandung yang bernaung dalam lembaga seni rupa ITB (Institut Teknologi Bandung). "Ini berkaitan dengan tumbuh dan berkembangnya corak seni abstrak di Bandung dalam kurun waktu 1960-an sampai 1980-an. Masa itu menandai adanya suatu mazab yang cukup kuat melingkupi seni rupa Bandung yang tidak lain dipelopori oleh kalangan akademis"<sup>3</sup>. Sampai kemudian kecenderungan ini mulai "diberontaki" oleh seniman muda Bandung. Mazab Bandung mulai dipertanyakan kembali oleh perupa seperti, Tisna Sanjaya, Arahmaiani, Semzar Siahaan, Irawan Karseno, Acep Zamzam dan yang lainnya. Mereka mulai menghadirkan sebentuk kerupaan yang berada di luar jalur formalisme Bandung, dengan menghadirkan seni yang memihak pada persoalan sosial serta kecenderungan seperti; instalasi, perforamace art dan lainnya.

Kelompok Abstrax hadir dalam semangat "pemberontakan" tersebut, mereka adalah seniman muda yang kembali gerah dengan persoalan seni rupa Bandung yang bergerak semakin melebar dan semakin luas. Dalam kondisi perluasan tersebut mereka memilih kembali konsen pada persoalan seni lukis, yang menurut mereka masih menyisakan persoalan. Abstrax menandakan konsen mereka pada stigma seni rupa Bandung dalam frame formalisme, untuk kemudian mereduksinya dalam penggalian artistik mereka yang keluar dari seni abstrak itu sendiri. Dan sebagai pilihan mereka pun mengembangkan bahasa representasi rupa realis, untuk kemudian mencari persoalan-persoalan yang lebih spesifik di dalamnya.

Rupa realistik dalam kesadaran para seniman, pada pameran ini didudukkan sebagai bahasa/ideom rupa tidak hanya sebagai wahana untuk membedah persoalan kontekstual. Akan tetapi ada kesadaran dari mereka untuk membedah persoalan dalam ideom rupa realistik itu sendiri dengan titik tolak realisme sebagai mainframe-nya. Dalam konteks ini ada upaya mempertanyakan kembali mengenai bahasa realis itu sendiri, mengenai realitas, mimesisme, tentang pencerapan oleh bidikan kamera, bahkan membawa rupa realis ke dalam wilayah formalistik. Munculnya kesamaan dalam taste pemilihan warna-warna pastel, latar belakang flat (datar), adanya kesamaan dalam pengkomposision subject matter dalam bidang kanvas, mewarnai kecenderungan dalam karya-karya mereka yang memiliki kedekatan dalam pencarian artistik.

Demikianlah para seniman dari dua kelompok dan dari dua kota yang berbeda, Bandung dengan formalismenya, Bali dengan tradisi dan muatan kelokalannya yang di tahun 1990-an juga mengarah pada pencarian bentuk formalistik (abstrak ekspresionis). Ternyata hal itu mengantarkan mereka pada pilihan yang sejenis yaitu rupa realis. Kecenderungan dari kedua kutub ini kemudian bertemu di jantung kota pariwisata Bali tepatnya di Biasa Art Space, hanya untuk trans-it sejenak dan kemudian mereka akan terus begerak, bertarung, membuktikan eksistensi mereka dalam medan seni rupa yang lebih luas.

## TRANS-IT: A sense of two Cities

### Curatorial Introduction

At a time when representation is returning as an important focus of attention in contemporary fine arts, realistic forms make up a significant language reference for composition in the art of painting.

This language can also be observed in a group exhibition by fourteen young artists from the Klinik Seni Taxu Bali<sup>1</sup> community:

Wayan Suja, Gede Puja, Gede Mahendra Yasa, Made Muliana, Agus Sumiantara, Ketut Moniarta, Dewa Ardana and Dodit Artawan.

from the Abstrax Bandung group<sup>2</sup>:

Guntur Timur, C Gunawan Suryasaputra, Imam Setiawan, Wily Himawan, Dadan Setiawan and Z. Ramli;

All of them start from a group consciousness, and more specifically in their artistic quest, they are concerned with developing painting in the framework of realistic form. Before analyzing further their work expression, let's take a look at the conditions surrounding the emergence of each of the two groups.

Klinik Seni Taxu was born out of a group of Denpasar university students restless about the situation of the arts in Bali. They felt the art world in Bali was in an "undynamic" state, caused by a sense of domination from the "one and only" trend (influenced during the 1990s by an orientation toward a formalist shape) that is often called "Balinese abstract expressionism"...

Therefore artistic search in Bali developed into the "one and only" form of quest in the fine arts in pursue of local content that revolve around Balinese tradition, religiosity and culture. The fine arts infrastructure of Bali supported this "one and only" search making difficult "to provide an opportunity" for other forms of artistic search to develop. Behind the creation of Klinik Seni Taxu movement is the spirit that wants to give rise to an artistic quest that attempts to develop outside the given Balinese artistic parameter.

The name Taxu in this context, is derived from the word Taksu.

Taksu, in the fine-arts lexis of Bali, is used to indicate a form of art that possesses magical power, such to become of sacred value. What people considered to be Taksu became, in the quest for art for sale to the tourists, mindless imitations.. slowly that sacredness got dissolved within the tourism industry, giving rise to a form of desacralization of art, along with the stigma of Bali as an exotic area.

In response to this issue the group responded to this issue by turning the word Taksu into Taxu.

The group started their work by focussing attention on contemporary issues in the social and artistic domains of Bali, going beyond the exoteric and exotic parameters.

Eventhough their artistic choices are directed at realistic forms which happen to connect with contemporary painting trends based on issues of representation, in practice they never fastened themselves in an absolute way to the formal language of realism.

KST representational language extends not only to the two-dimensional medium (painting) but also to other media such as installation art and video art.

Klompok Abstrak is born in Bandung which is renowned for its formalist art, its "western laboratory" as the arts of Bandung have been dubbed under the auspices of the Fine Arts Institute of ITB (the Bandung Institute of Technology). "This is related to the growth and development of a type of abstract art in Bandung between 1960 and the 1980, a time that marked the existence of a school of thought that quite strongly encompassed the fine arts of Bandung, and was pioneered by none other than ITB<sup>3</sup>". The tendency of this school of thought was resisted by young artists of Bandung such as Tisna Sanjaya, Arahmaiani, Semizar Siahaan, Irawan Karseno, Acep Zamzam and others. They began to present a form of fine art situated outside the lines of Bandung formalism, art that took sides with social issues as well as leaning toward installations, performance art and so on.

Kelompok Abstrax is present within this spirit of resistance; the group is composed by young artists restless again about the issues concerning visual art in Bandung, and whose motion is ever expanding and widening.. The group indicates its position in contrast with the formalism stigma of the arts in Bandung by adopting the name Abstrax (in Indonesian Abstract is written Abstrak) used as a phonetic trick to point at their artistic explorations outside the realm of abstract art alone. By choice they use a representational language of realistic form (i.e. portrait and landscape) on which to base their exploration for more development later on.


In the consciousness of the artists in this exhibition, realistic forms are meant not only as an idiom, but also as a vehicle for dissecting contextual problems. They use realism as their 'mainframe' from where to operate through color, composition, subject matter, in an effort to raise questions about the language of realism itself, reality, mimesis; about the process of perception by a camera shot, and even about bringing realistic form into the area of formalism. Similarities emerge: in a taste for pastel color choices, flat backgrounds; affinities exist in the composition of subject matter on the plane of the canvas, coloring tendencies in their works that have a pulse within the artistic quest.

It appears that these artists from two different groups and two different cities Bandung with its formalism, and Denpasar with its traditions and local content - have been led to a similar choice, the one of realist forms. Their discourse now meet in Bali, the heart of the tourism, at Biasa Art Space, to transit in a momentary pause and further continue moving, colliding, and proving their existence in wider domains of the fine arts.






















